- *services and placement,
- *what to do if the team decides the student is not eligible,
- *what happens after the close of the Team meeting,

Week 1: Intro to Digital Music

Week 4: Mixing and Effects

Week 5: Creative Arranging and Start of Final Projects

Week 6: Podcasting and Final Project Work

Week 7: History of Music Production and Digital Music Making and Final Project Work

Week 8: Exporting Final Projects and Conclusions

VIRTUAL PROGRAM for 2020/21. Each band class consists of 4-6 students and 1 teacher and is comprised of drums, guitar, bass, vocals, and can also include keyboards.

* Students learn to play their individual instruments, develop a set list, and work as a group, all with guidance from our trained teaching staff.

* Band sets can include original material and/or cover songs chosen by the students.

* All bands will perform at an end of session concert.

Autism Speaks has partnered with Snip-its and Melmark New England to develop a haircutting training guide that will make the haircutting experience more positive for children with autism. The haircutting training guide provides information for stylists about autism and what they can do to make the process more successful. It includes information for families about how to prepare for a haircut and a visual schedule to help the child understand the steps involved in the process.
